FREE LEGAL CLINIC FOR LOW-INCOME CLIENTS ON POWERS OF ATTORNEY AND ADVANCE DIRECTIVES

Pro Bono Attorneys Can Attend Training on April 28<sup>th</sup>

The Fourteenth Judicial Circuit Pro Bono Committee, in collaboration with Prairie State Legal Services, Inc., is hosting free legal clinics in May in the Quad Cities area to help low-income seniors and people with disabilities prepare Powers of Attorney and Living Wills. Pro bono attorneys will help clients determine:

- How they would want to be treated if they had a serious accident
- Who would make decisions for them if they are unable to due to serious illness
- What their wishes are about medical treatment if they are ill

Clinics will be offered on Wednesday, May 6 from 9-11 am in East Moline, or 2-4 pm in Rock Island, or on Monday, May 11 from 9-11 am in Milan or 2-4 pm in Rock Island. Call Cherie Myers of Prairie State at (309) 794-1328 to see if you qualify and to schedule an appointment.
